CESD Parent Survey Results


This year there were four questions and the questions and results are as follows:

- I feel that my child is safe while at school
 over 98% agreed or strongly agreed with this statement
- 2. I am satisfied with the overall quality of education that my child is receiving -Over 98% agreed or strongly agreed with this statement
- 3. My child's teachers believe in him/her and he/she is appropriately challenged and encouraged in the classroom

 -Over 98% agreed or strongly agreed with this statement
- 4. I am satisfied with the overall communication that the school provides me -Over 94% agreed or strongly agreed with this statement

We are extremely pleased with the results of our survey. 118 of our parents replied and the results are strong across the board. This is great recognition for us for all the great work we do for kids.

Successes Literacy Levels, 2018-2019



Literacy instruction has been a goal here for 9 years and we are seeing teachers meeting each child's differentiated reading needs. As teachers learn more about their students as learners they are able to identify specific literacy supports needed. Through RTI groupings, assistive technology, and individualized intensive support, our students are improving as readers at Penhold School.

Literacy Interventions

All students receive a level A assessment to help us provide appropriate programming.

School staff focused on literacy strategies to support all of our learners through universal strategies. Common scheduled Daily 5 literacy blocks, common grade team literacy learning goals and collaboration contributed to success.

For students needing more support to achieve at grade level, we utilized direct teacher instruction to individual or targeted supports and social emotional strategies to support students.

We also access a variety of additional supports including: Speech, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Mental Health, Psychologists, Vision Consultant, Behaviour Specialist and Family School Wellness

Planning for 2019-2020

As a school we are constantly looking for ways to improve student learning. This year we are making a considerable effort to work as collaborative teams to meet the needs of all students. To do this staff are collaborating on their professional learning goals and admin are working hard as instructional leaders by getting into classrooms, collaborating on literacy comprehension strategies and having meaningful conversations with teachers on how to improve student learning.

We consistently look at recent research to inform our planning.

This year we are increasing our usage of literacy assessments as well as monthly 'collaborative response model' meetings to discuss targeted and universal 'best practice' teaching strategies for our students




- Learning Support Team consisting of administrators and one grade team teacher

- 90 Chromebooks and 25 Chromeboxes.


